

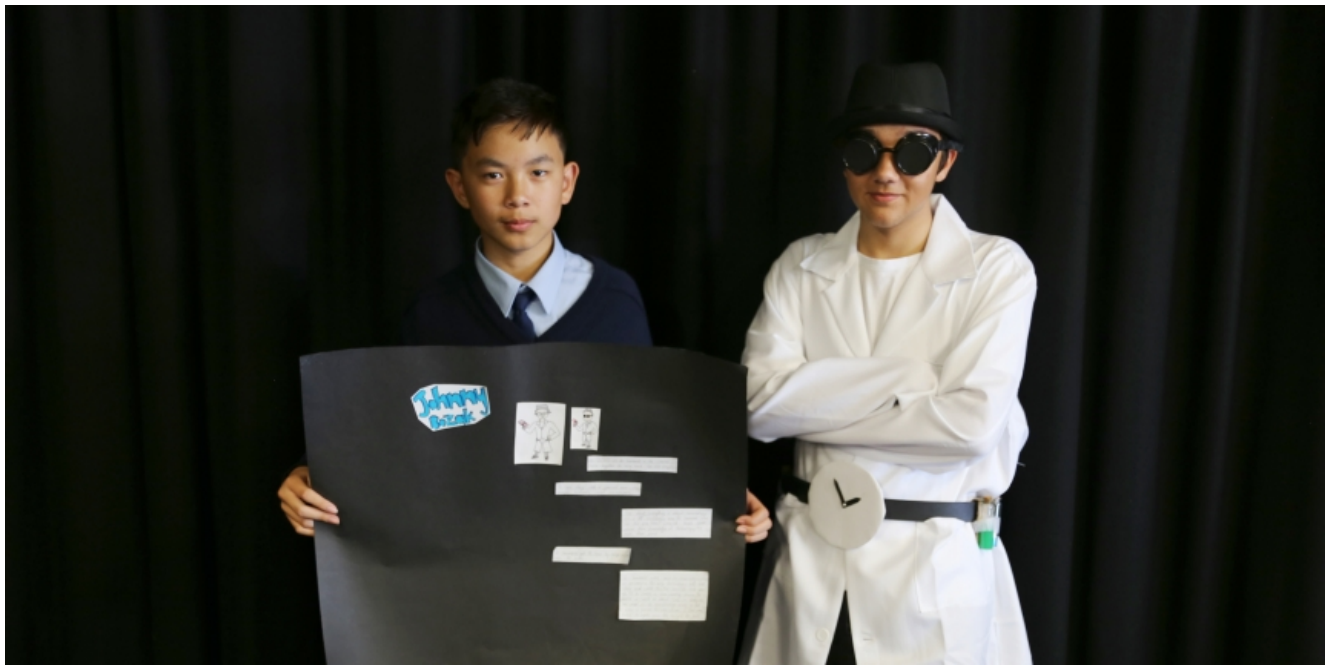

This costume is built around a wealthy and very privileged girl. We used a ribbed material to make a slim fitting skirt which adds to the rich aspect of her costume. We have embroidered a neutral theme of patterns down a black bodice, a white mesh cape with raised gears as if it is a old clock, and slip on flats to show style but also comfort when fighting.

This costume is built around the main character's love for a variety of games and embroidery thread. The colors of her costume include black, blue, purple and gold. The costume is elegant and adds to her character and backstory.

Story outline:
 In the year 2090, in the futuristic city, AURA, there are 4 districts separated between an inner circle and outer circle. There is one district in the inner circle, AURA, and in where the government officials, their families and any soldiers reside. In the outer circle, it is divided into 4 quarters where each quarter stands for a different district - A, (advanced) - in the with technology; U (understand) - have supernatural abilities which bloom at the age of 16; R (restrained) - these people have a deep sense of strength and are "restricted" in other districts, are the fighters; and A, (attractive) - passionate and caring (the business and medical). The main city consists of a small mix of these people, and is usually the highly respected and important people in society. In the 2090s, the sectors are starting to rise up against the city and no longer want to supply help to the city as a result of being mistreated and taking advantage of by corrupt officials. The 4 districts need to work together to take down the now corrupt government to prevent further damage to their sectors. The protagonists, both born in 2073, Anissa (17) and Karolina Bane (16) are the daughters of Apepe and Albert Bane who were being targeted in District U. Until their father was reported when the girls were young due to spyings and Albert was forced to become a leader in the inner ring the districts and bringing Kara with him. The girls find out they have powers when they were 16. Their powers were meant to be a secret to everyone but themselves and the government but Anissa and Kara come to believe that they only have half their power meaning that they somehow have to meet and get in contact. Kara can control time and Anissa can control dreams and sleep. Kara finds out of the other districts' weaknesses (which are unknown to the city) and decides to meet with Anissa to solve their problems but they have to be careful as she could be put to death if they found her. Fast forward a couple of months Kara and Anissa are leading a revolution and with their powers they are able to put the leaders of society and have been forming their own group, recruiting people from all districts through their main allies from each of the cities. After 12 months there is a full on war between the now reorganised districts and the inner ring, with Kara and Anissa in the lead against the city and people in power!
