They will have the opportunity to test their robots, respond to unexpected challenges, learn from others and show their skills in a very different environment. These are precisely the kinds of learning experiences that help students grow and develop character. The competition is focused more on learning and enjoyment and I am looking forward to seeing our students collaborate whilst becoming effective problem solvers on the day.

Term 3 also marks the final term of formal schooling for our Year 12 students. Very soon they will

sit their Trial HSC examinations. This can naturally be a time of nerves and pressure, but it is also an important opportunity for students to demonstrate what they know, what they understand, and what they are able to do. During the break, the College was pleased to support Year 12 students through onsite study days, and I was delighted to see so many students make the most of this time to study and prepare well.

We wish our Year 12 students every blessing as they enter this important season. Please be in prayer for them as they sit their exams.

This year, our College theme has been Discover. It is a word rich with meaning. To discover is more than simply to find something. It is to enter a journey of exploration.
